SOS Program Helps Students Succeed

It's a program that began at CCS in January, but it is already helping secondary Learning Center students make a positive transition to the school's curriculum and increasing leadership opportunities for other students.

The Students Offering Support (SOS) program is the brainchild of CCS NILD/Discovery Director Bridget Hughes. Bridget actually initiated the program at another school, before coming to CCS, as a way to help students who were having difficulty taking notes. The program was started to "help kids in the Learning Center who needed tests read to them or scribes to supplement their notes," she says.

The program provides note taking and reading assistance to Learning Center students via student helpers, who give a copy of lecture notes and/or review sheets to the Learning Center Director or who offer reading assistance to the students during their study halls. In turn, the student helpers receive service hours and gain leadership skills.

Currently there are about 58 high school student helpers: 38 readers and 20 note takers. Note taking assistance is available to secondary students only; reading assistance is available to kindergarten through twelfth grade students. In the future, the program will be expanded to include middle school helpers.

The premise of the program, according to Bridget, is based on the following quote from Joyce Meyer:

"We need to have an influence on people and encourage them to do uncommon things...knowing that they have a God-ordained destiny to fill. Common people with uncommon goals who make an uncommon commitment can help an uncommon number of people who can lead other common people to do uncommon things!"
