SCHOOL

Founded in 1978 and located northwest of Houston, Cypress Christian School (CCS) is an independent, non-denominational, K-12 college preparatory school with selective admissions. As a private Christian school, the Christian emphasis and biblical worldview are an integral part of the academic curriculum, weekly chapel services, athletics, fine arts and special programs.

The admissions policy requiring one parent to be a Christian encourages a Christ-centered partnership between parents and school. The power of a cooperative effort between home, school and the church are second to none for the purpose of providing a strong foundation for young lives. CCS students are challenged to develop their full potential and are taught by teachers committed to academic excellence and to the Christian faith.

MISSION

The mission of Cypress Christian School is to honor the Lord Jesus Christ by providing students an education based upon academic excellence and biblical values.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Selective admissions are based on an application, interview and testing process which determines if there is a spiritual match, academic match, and behavioral match.

ACCREDITATION

CCS is accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), Texas Private School Accreditation Commission (TEPSAC) and AdvanceD.

FACILITY

CCS employs 73 faculty members. All are degreed and certified by ACSI and/or the state of Texas.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

The school year and grading periods are divided into two semesters. There are eight class periods each day from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

CLASS RANK & GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Semester grades on transcripts are unweighted. Quality points for AP and honors-level courses are reflected in total weighted grade point averages. CCS does not provide a numerical class rank. Final semester grades earned in courses taken in grades 9-12 are included in the GPA calculation except for Athletic, P.E., Discovery and Teacher's Aide courses.

CURRICULAR

The academic program is organized into two semesters. Coordination of curriculum among departments is stressed, providing the student with reinforcement of studies across subjects. AP, Pre-AP, and honors-level courses are offered for core subjects beginning the freshman year. Students are eligible for honors/AP if the previous course in that subject averages a 90+.

AP AND HONORS COURSES

17 Advanced Placement courses offered: Art, Calculus, Capstone Seminar, Capstone Research, Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Government, Physics, Pre-Calculus, Spanish, Statistics, U.S. History, and World History. Students may take a maximum of six AP courses per year.

Pre-AP and Honors courses offered: Algebra II, Anatomy/Physiology, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Engineering, English, Geometry, Spanish II, Spanish III, World Geography.

CO-CURRICULAR

CCS offers the following co-curricular opportunities: academic competitions, fine arts competitions, athletic competitions, afterschool clubs, Ambassador Council, National Art Honor Society, National English Honor Society, National Thespian Society and National Honor Society. CCS competes in TAPPS.
